


# King Athelstan Weekly Digest Issue 13 - Friday 5th December 2025

Full Lockdown Locks, Lights, Out of Sight!

Today we had a full lockdown practice. The children were AMAZING. We only do lockdown practices that we tell the children about in advance and prepare them for. The preparation includes practising the responses to the instruction 'locks, lights, out of sight' and hearing the bell quietly in the classroom environment. As it was a practice, Mrs Ahearn and I walked around the school to see if we could spot anyone. It was like a giant game of hide and seek and the school was totally silent, dark and we thought that 400 children and 50 staff had simply disappeared in an instant. Well done everyone, you were brilliant at hiding!

As many of you will be aware, schools across the borough - and nationally - are seeing a drop in pupil numbers due to lower birth rates and more families moving out of London because of rising cost of living. This situation has serious implications on school budgets, which were already stretched, as the school budget is based on per pupil funding. At King Athelstan we need to continue to make significant changes in order to be able to set a balanced budget for the financial year, which starts in April 2026, and for successive years. Sadly, this reflects the financial challenge that affects many public services across the country. We have had to make the difficult decision to change the teaching arrangements in Year 1 from January in order to reduce expenditure. Mrs Campbell, who is employed through an agency, will be leaving at Christmas. Mrs Ahearn, our Deputy Head, will take over Mrs Campbell's days, working alongside Miss Wharton. Mrs Campbell is an excellent, dedicated teacher and she has fitted into our school team brilliantly. We would like to thank her for her commitment to the class over this term. She will be greatly missed by pupils, families, and staff, and we know you will join us in wishing her the very best for the future.

A huge thank you to the PCSA and everyone who made the Festive Fair last Saturday so successful. The Choir sounded wonderful, and we were so lucky to have a visit from Santa himself!

We had a visit this week from Sarah Cantrill, who did so much work with us last term to produce the amazing celebration of 1100 years since the coronation of King Athelstan's. She spent time with Y6 working on the final stage of the King Athelstan 1100 project - more details to follow.

### Toys/Home Items in School

As the holiday season generates additional excitement around new toys and other items, please can we continue to insist that, in line with our policy, non-essential items are not brought into school without prior permission from staff. We have all the resources children need in school, including toys and sensory tools. If you feel your child needs something specifically different, or they want to bring an item in to show, please discuss this with staff in advance. It is particularly important that no electronic items, which are increasingly capable of sound and image recording, are brought into school (including smart watches) as this presents a significant safeguarding risk. Twice this week we have had to take electronic devices off children and delete images taken in school. Please keep all items like this at home. Children are not allowed to wear watches that have the capacity take digital photographs or connect to the internet. Thank you for your support in this.
