


Dear Families,

Messages from the Office

The school office would like to send a few reminders to families:

- Please book your child's lunch on ParentPay. The menu is on the website here. You can book meals up to October half-term, after which there will be a new menu.
- We are a **no nuts** school. Please do not pack any nut products in your child's bag as we have several children with severe nut allergies in school.
- If your child accidently brings home an ice/heat pack, please return it to school!
- Children are not permitted to wear any nail polish to school.
- All children should be wearing plain black footwear, including soles, whether it is PE day or not.
- Children may wear small stud earrings only if they are able to remove/cover them for PE.
 No other jewellery is permitted, apart from religious jewellery.
- Please put your child's name on all items and clothes in school so that anything 'lost' can be returned
- Remember to let the office know in good time if your pick-up arrangements change. We will not dismiss a child without confirmation from parent/carer

High Temperatures

We have had a number of children in school today with raised temperatures, and they have had to be sent home to rest and recover. If your child has a high temperature, we kindly ask that you don't give Calpol (or similar medicine) to reduce a fever and then send your child into school, as a raised temperature can be a sign of an infectious illness. If your child has a high temperature, please keep them at home until their temperature has returned to normal without the use of medication. We appreciate your support in helping to keep all our children, staff, and families safe and well. SIMs Parent App

There are still some families who haven't registered and updated their details on the SIMS Parent App. It is important that we receive accurate and up-to-date information for all students as soon as possible. You will have received an email from noreply@sims.co.uk with an activation link (please check your junk/spam folders if you haven't seen it). This was sent to the main parental email address we have on file.

To complete your registration:

- Click the link in the activation email to set up your account.
- Download the SIMS Parent app from the App Store or Google Play, or log in at www.sims-arent.co.uk.
- Open the app, review your child(ren)'s details, and make any necessary updates.

Applying for Secondary School

Applications for secondary school places in Kingston for children currently in Y6 can be submitted online via the <u>eAdmissions website</u> between 1st September 2025 and 31st October 2025. Many school open days are taking place in the next couple of weeks. For details of open day events <u>click here</u>. You do not need to complete an application if your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). Instead contact your assessment coordinator to discuss your child's school placement.

Google Classroom

For full details of Google Classroom and how to log in, please see the page on our <u>website here</u>. Children's log ins and passwords are on a sticker at the back of their reading record books. There are also log in details for J2e, Times Tables Rockstars (or NumBots for younger children) which are all online Maths platforms we encourage children to use at home to practise their skills. New Nursery and Reception children will be issued their log in details very soon.





Children also have access to Oxford Owl, a free ebook library. The log in is the same as for J2e but without the .314. For example:

Year 3 French

Year 3 were buzzing with excitement this week as they began their journey into learning French. We learned how to say 'hello' and 'my name is...'. and got to know each other. French is delivered every other week throughout KS2. Learning French provides children with a fun and engaging introduction to a new language and culture. At this stage, pupils typically develop basic speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills through songs, games, stories, and simple conversations. They begin to



build vocabulary and understand how the language works, laying a strong foundation for future language learning.



Learning French also helps to improve memory, confidence, and communication skills, while fostering curiosity and respect for other cultures. It's a valuable and enjoyable part of the primary curriculum. Keep an eye out on Google Classroom as I will be providing updates on what we have been learning and ways that you can practice at home.
