- Talked about the word 'evacuation', which is linked to the fire drills we do •
- Talked about 'invacuation' as lockdown, meaning we come inside the school
- Talked about a 'partial' lockdown (everyone coming inside the school and closing doors and windows) and continuing our learning as usual, and 'full' lockdown' (everyone in their classrooms, staying quiet).
- Read a story about a (friendly) dog coming on to the school site because it could smell sausage rolls and the • school doing a partial lockdown until it was caught and re-united with its owner.
- Listened to the sound of the on-screen alert that we are introducing as well as the sound of a pulsing alarm which are part of our new procedures.

Watch this space for more information - please rest assured, we train children in a very child-centred way, just like the fire evacuation.

The weather forecast next week is for temperatures in excess of 30 degrees - please see the email sent earlier today.

Enjoy the weekend - don't forget INSET day on Friday 4th July when children are not in school.
