## World Mental Health Day

## School Lunch Survey

We are working with WilsonJones, our catering provider, to create a new school lunch menu for introduction in the spring term 2026, that will meet the needs of our diverse community. Please note, halal refers to food that is will some prepared in accordance with Islamic dietary auidelines. In the UK, halal-certified meat must
