This week our focus in school was on **Perseverance**, the first of our five **PRIDE** values. Next week, we will focus on **Respect**, which fits beautifully with anti-bullying week and marking armistice day.

Dear Families,

We hope you all had a lovely half-term. It has been a busy first week back, particularly with our Open Event last night and Outdoor Learning Day yesterday. Today we held a well-attended Parent/Carer Forum and have had Governors' Visit Day. This is a day when our governors spend time in school looking at all aspects of school life, and the school development plan priorities in action. They also talk to the children and have presentations from staff, as well as looking at samples of the children's work.

Thank you to those of you who completed the questionnaire about the school lunch menu and the potential introduction of Halal meat. Your feedback was really helpful. We are now working with WilsonJones in order to implement some changes in response to your comments, and we will get back to you with more details. One query some families had was around the adherence to animal welfare standards in the preparation of Halal meat. WilsonJones have been very clear around this:

Halal refers to food that is prepared in accordance with Islamic dietary guidelines. In the UK, halal-certified meat must meet both food safety regulations and halal requirements.

Please be reassured that the halal meat being proposed for use is stunned before slaughter. Stunning ensures that the animal is unconscious and does not feel pain at the point of slaughter. This process fully complies with UK animal welfare standards while also meeting halal certification requirements.

Our approach is intended to be inclusive of pupils' different dietary needs and respectful of faith practices, while also upholding animal welfare standards.

Other key things we will look at include portion sizes, the variety of fruit and availability of all items on the menu. There were a few questions about jelly - we want to reassure you that **all** the jelly is vegan.

The week is not over yet! Tonight are the Halloween discos for Y3-4 and Y5-6. These have been organised by a parent as fun, fund-raising events, and the PCSA have supported with ticket sales.

If you have a good idea and would like to organise an event, then please go to the PCSA team with a proposal. You would be required to plan and run the event but there is lots of support for things like risk assessments and ticket sales. All proceeds go to the PCSA to support the school.

The PCSA is continuing to look for volunteers to support the running of all their events. Please consider being a volunteer. If lots of people do a little bit, then so much can be achieved and no one is overloaded. Please email the PCSA on kingathelstanpcsa@gmail.com. also their mental health and wellbeing.




Maths Events

Community Messages

In this section of the Digest we include information received from other agencies. We are not promoting these items, but include them in good faith as they may be of interest to King Athelstan families:

Big Sister Programme- Places Leisure are running the <u>Big Sister Project</u> at Tolworth Recreation Centre and the Malden Centre, an initiative designed to get more girls active and introduce (or reintroduce) them to sport. The Big Sisters act as role models, empowering and enabling girls aged 9-15 to enjoy sport, exercise, and physical activity during puberty. Importantly, the project is shaped by girls, for girls, providing ambassadors who champion the benefits of sport and understand the challenges they face. For more information and to sign up, visit the places leisure website here. As part of the programme, girls can access the Big Sister Flexible Membership at £9 per month (50% off the standard Junior membership), which includes: unlimited gym use during Junior Gym hours (with induction for 11-15 year olds), unlimited swimming, age-appropriate group workout classes, including exclusive We Move sessions, free racket sports at off-peak times (Malden Centre only), support from a friendly on-site team.

Fairfield Litter Pick - A huge thanks to the 20 litter heroes who collected 5 big bags of rubbish (including 2 of recycling) on World Clean Up Day in September.
