Thinker's Project

- Work can be presented in a variety of ways video and audio clips, items on paper and 3D models. Please note that this term all PP, video or audio clips need to be uploaded to Google Classroom by Tuesday 8th July. This will enable us to make a compilation to share at the exhibition.
- Each piece of work will receive recognition from the class teacher.
- End of term "Thinker's Project" exhibition: This will be held at the end of every term and is an opportunity to celebrate the work that has been completed. At least one piece of completed "Thinker's Project" work from every child will be on show at the exhibition.
