We are really pleased to inform you that a number of children have completed their home reading charts and will be having a celebration with their teacher shortly.

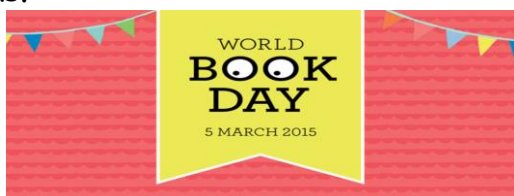
We would really like to thank you all for your support with this initiative. It has resulted in much more reading happening in the home and is impacting on pupil's progress in reading!
