Go Sugar Free this February

Change4Life Campaign has released a "sugar app" that parents/carers and children can use to scan products barcodes to better understand how much sugar is in food. Research suggests that on average, children aged four to ten years old are consuming 22kg of refined sugar a year. That's about 5,500 sugar cubes! As a Healthy School we think this app is an easy and modern way to support us in making healthier choices and help to curb some of the issues caused by too much sugar such as diabetes and tooth decay.
