#### Free Summer Activities

- Thumbs Up It's Thursday! Fun, educational and free activities running across Kingston Town Centre. See: https://www.inkingston.co.uk/thumbsup
- Cycle or walk to Richmond along the Thames Path by John Lewis. You will pass through Canbury Gardens, then Teddington Lock and can watch the boats go through. You will also pass Ham House and lots of places to picnic.



- Cycle or walk to Hampton Court: cross the bridge at Kingston, turn left and keep walking until you reach Hampton Court. It is free to enter most of the grounds. You can walk or cycle all the way!
- Take a picnic to Bushey Park just over Kingston Bridge. There is a large children's playground here.
