Please note that the final Inset day of the year has been confirmed as Friday 29<sup>th</sup> June. Children do not come to school on this day.

#### Medication in school

As a school we recognise that in some circumstances children may require medicine during the school day. However there may be occasions where the school will be unable to administer medicines in school and alternative arrangements may need to be made by the parent/carer. All medicine must be signed in via the school office this includes Salbutamol Inhalers.

The school will **only** administer the following non-prescription medicines:

- Paracetamol or Ibuprofen (for pain relief)
- Piriton or a similar product (for treatment of allergic reactions, hayfever etc)

The school will only administer Antibiotics if they are required at least 4 times per day (or every 6 hours).

Please note that the school can only administer medicines as directed by the prescriber. If there is any variation of dose required, the school must be provided with written evidence from the prescriber.

Remember, if children are sick they must stay off school for 48 hours

Please ask at the office if you have any concerns, or to view the full Medicines Policy. Please note, this policy is currently under review.
