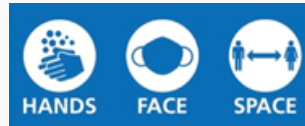




King Athelstan Primary School

The Virtual Approach

We have had to adapt many of our procedures and have found virtual solutions:

School Tours—We run regular Zoom sessions with a virtual school tour hosted by Miss Newton for any prospective parents or carers wishing to view the school.

Assembly - we have pre-recorded school assemblies which children watch in classrooms. We also have a virtual Achievement Assembly every week, and certificates are handed out in class.

Parent/Carer Consultations (week beginning 19th October for Nursery, and the week beginning 16th November for Reception to Year 6)—these will be conducted online by video calls with teachers. Details have already gone out to Nursery, and will follow soon for the rest of the school with information on how to book and access the calls.

WilsonJones

WilsonJones, our in-house caterers, have published their latest menu. We are still only able to offer packed-lunch style meals, which can be booked on ParentPay up until half-term. WilsonJones have worked hard to choose packaging and presentation that takes environmental issues into consideration. The dessert pots they use are made from recycled plastic, and are recyclable. Metal spoons for yogurt are washed instead of using plastic ones. Single-use water bottles are no longer supplied, and cartons of fruit juice are only issued occasionally. Please ensure that you book meals in advance for your child if they are not bringing a packed lunch from home.

Kingston Libraries

Libraries within Kingston are now open but have had to make changes to how they operate. Visitors are asked to wear a face covering and use hand sanitiser. 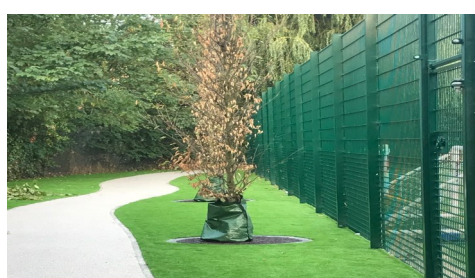
Back by popular demand is our Amazon Wish List! For anyone who wishes to make a donation we have set up a list of items that you can purchase and they will be sent

KS2 Playground

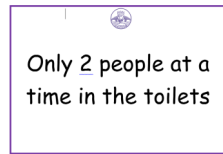
The children have probably told you about our amazing new eco-friendly KS2 playground, which was completed during lockdown. We still have some planting to do in the spring, and the pond and growing area are yet to be developed. The artificial grass is porous and conforms to SuDS regulations (sustainable drainage system). Any rainwater goes directly back underground. It has an expected life of 20 years, allowing a huge number of children the benefit of being able to enjoy the surface all year round. We chose natural timber for the play equipment to reduce plastic use. It is long-lasting, untreated, sustainably sourced FSC-certified timber. We kept all excavated material on site to reduce landfill and unnecessary road transport. Hardcore was re-used under the new MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) and the rest has been used in the mounds. The re-use of the old tarmac in the mounds and MUGA also reduced the need for primary aggregates. The soft surfacing is also SuDS compliant and is made from recycled truck tyres.



Our School



School looks a little different this term, both inside and out. We have lots of signs to remind everyone about 2m social distancing. Our corridors have arrows to help us all remember to keep to our one-way systems, and even the toilets have restrictions. Everyone is hand-washing thoroughly and regularly.



In **EYFS** the classroom environment looks almost the same as normal, however, behind the scenes is a rigorous routine of additional cleaning of resources, quarantining of items and new systems of organisation. We have a big focus on natural materials in EYFS, with lots of wood and hessian.

Reception and Year 1 eat lunch in the large and small hall respectively.



In **Year 1** the classroom is set up for the transition between EYFS and KS1.

(right), but from **Year 2** upwards, all the desks face the front and each child has a pouch on the back of their chair for their resource packs. The children are really enjoying this way of learning. Lunch is eaten in class at desks before going outside to play. As you can imagine, we have a high focus on basic skills after such a long gap in learning, however, the children continue to have wider curriculum learning, particularly through our subject specialists.



Wiltshire Room—Inclusion

The Wiltshire Room and the Inclusion staff continue to host daily Nurture Groups for Years 1 and 2, and are also able to respond to the needs of individuals throughout the school day. As with other shared spaces, there are strict routines of cleaning between sessions.
