Free School Meals

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to universal free school meals. Please book menu choices on ParentPay. If your child has entered Year 3 (or is older) and you are in receipt of any of the following benefits, you may still be entitled to free school meals: Could your child be entitled to a

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll also qualify for the Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF). You have to apply before each holiday. Click here to find out how to apply for the Christmas holidays 2022.

Harvest Festival



On Monday 26th September, children will have an assembly about the Harvest Festival. From Tuesday 27th - Friday 30th September there will be a table outside where any donations can be left for the Kingston Food Bank. They can only work with non-perishable food and hygiene items (tinned and dried goods), which do not spoil or decay. All items should be unopened, in-date and undamaged. They are forbidden by law to give away food which has passed its "use by" date, and they have no storage

facilities for fresh food. Ideal items are: breakfast cereals, pasta sauces, tinned vegetables, tinned meat, rice and sponge pudding, UHT milk, squash, household cleaning products, shower gel, personal hygiene products and sanitary wear. Thank you.

Polio Booster Vaccinations

Following the recent detection of polio virus in sewage samples in London, the NHS is offering all 1-9 year olds in London a polio booster vaccination.

Polio is an infection caused by a virus that attacks the nervous system - it can cause permanent paralysis of muscles. By giving an extra polio vaccine dose, this will boost each child's protection.

The polio vaccine is safe and effective. The vaccine is given as part of a combined jab to babies, toddlers, and teenagers as part of the NHS routine childhood vaccination schedule. Children need to have all these vaccinations to be fully vaccinated against polio. The NHS in London has contacted parents/carers to come forward for a booster or catch-up polio dose - families should take up the offer as soon as possible.

The Red Box

The Red Box is a scheme that we run in school. The Red Box contains sanitary protection that girls can access whenever they need. The box provides a selection of products as well as tights and underwear to ensure that students can take whatever they need to ensure they are happy, clean and confident for the whole month. The boxes are made up of donations and the scheme is run by the Nurture Team and is completely free. Our box is located in Wiltshire, the Inclusion Room. Girls can just ask any member of staff for the Red Box when they need it.
