Free School Meals

All children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 are entitled to Universal Infant free school meals. If your child is in Year 3 to 6 and you receive either Income Support or Child Tax Credit (not Working Tax Credit) you may be entitled to claim for Free School Meals. Please also apply if your child is in Reception, Y1 or Y2 as we may be entitled to extra funding for your child. If you are entitled to Free School meals and register by 17th May you will receive £15 FSM vouchers for the May Half term.

We will be learning more about the Queen and famous historical events that have happened over the decades of her reign. We will be taking

for the Jubilee". In the afternoon, we will be holding a 'Street Party' on the playground, with jelly and ice cream, music from the decades, and also a performance from the choir. We will be ending the day with everyone singing the National Anthem. This is a moment in history that we will never see again in our lifetimes and we want to make sure that it is memorable for the children and that their wisdom and knowledge is broadened by their learning.

Fundraising

We would like to give a big 'shout out' to Lula (Wiley Class) and Maia (Cassatt Class) who held a garage sale at their house last weekend to raise money for charity. They managed to make £155 and have decided to split the money between a charity helping the people of Ukraine, and the

Big Outdoor Project to refurbish our KS1 playground. Well done to both girls for thinking of others and being so generous.

Spotlight on Geography

In geography this year, the children at King Athelstan have been travelling around the globe, exploring different areas as well as learning about different geographical features. Looking at the impact of human's work on our planet, they also had the opportunity to show their concern for their environment and investigate how to preserve their precious Earth in their daily life.

In Early Years, children are observing their surroundings, learning about where they come from and about other children in the classroom. The children are also being exposed to other cultures though food tasting and different celebration.

In Y1 the children have been working on their map skills by following and mapping familiar routes. Throughout the year, they have been recording the weather daily and identifying seasonal changes.

Y2 children started the year by investigating the key physical features of Kingston using aerial photographs and plans to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

They have devised their own simple maps and constructed basic symbols in a key. Last term, they expanded their understanding of maps by observing famous London landmarks, exploring what they look like and how

they are represented on maps. They have observed, in particular, the Monument near Pudding Lane and St Paul's Cathedral.

In Y3 the children have been exploring the impact of climate change on the wider world, debating if anything can bedone to stop global warming.

Learning about the continent of Africa and some of the countries within it, they

have explored the political and physical geography of this complex continent and have investigated the diversity of its landscapes and climate. They have also compared life in Africa to life in the United Kingdom.

Last term in Y4, the children have been reading ancient and modern maps of Britain, investigating the stunning legacy that the Romans left behind on these shores. While learning about the Mount Vesuvius eruption in history, they have been studying volcanoes, their fascinating features and their impact on nature as well as humans.

Y5 were able to explore coastlines in the UK and other countries and how they can be modified due to erosion and climate change. They have also looked at the impact on humans on those geographical features and the part they have to play in preserving the Britishcoast and preventing climate change. Later in the term the

children "visited" the Greek Islands and mainland, comparing the physical geography and climate to that of their own in the UK. They were able to look at Greece's major landmarks from natural to man-made and historical to present. They even had a special Greek day, spending an afternoon perusing Greek landmarks and tasting very delicious real Greek food!

In Y6, the children have spent their geography lessons debating the issue of deforestation, especially in regards to the Amazon Rainforest. They have investigated how logging and aggressive wood manufacture has impacted on climate change as well as how it has devastated the homelands and habitats of the animals that live there.
