Dear Families,

This week all the children and staff at King Athelstan have been using their imagination, focussing on one of our core PRIDE values. Miss Meggitt spoke to the children in our whole school, virtual assembly all about thinking creatively and 'outside of the box.' There are examples all over the school showing how children and staff use their imagination and creative thinking in order to 'dive deeper' and explore their learning further to reach our high expectations. I enjoyed investigating this aspect of learning at King Athelstan and have set pupils the task of sharing with me ways in which they have been creative in their thinking - I have already had some pupil responses: please keep these coming! I will share them in an assembly soon.

Thank you for your ongoing patience and understanding as we navigate through more challenging times and also for the extra effort to ensure that we slow the spread of COVID-19 at King Athelstan. Please continue with the daily Lateral Flow tests for your child for at least the next week. If positive, your child should self-isolate. If they have a negative lateral flow test on day 5 and day 6 (24 hours apart) they can cease isolating and return to school. We are closely working with our local Public Health team to examine the actions required to minimise the transmission of Covid. Do also remember that if your child is well enough whilst self-isolating, they can access isolation work on Google Classroom remotely. Unfortunately, due to staff shortages, we have had to cancel early morning reading and maths interventions until after half term.

### School Crossing



Mr Garside, our Lollipop man, has asked us to pass on a message to families: Queuing along the road by the zebra crossing for access to King Athelstan is causing congestion. Parents, carers and children sometimes cannot cross the zebra crossing safely onto the footpath, especially when people stop to chat with their friends. It can also cause confusion, as it may be unclear who is waiting to cross. Please keep the pavement by the crossing on the school side clear, and join the queue along Villiers Road towards the **Children's Centre**. We would also like to add that the crossing is there to enable everyone to cross this busy road safely, so please do not cross through the traffic with young children.



This week in Year 6, we have continued to learn about the heart and circulatory system. As part of this, we experienced learning how to dissect a lamb's heart! Year 6 pupils were able to see the ventricles, valves and heartstrings (yes, we found out they really are called that!) in a real organ. This exciting lesson has strengthened our understanding of how the heart functions and given us the opportunity to take part in a lesson normally saved for secondary school!

Also in science, we have been making blood! Year 6 are excited to present their own mini documentaries all about the main components of blood and functions of each element.

In English, we have been writing a persuasive holiday leaflet - it has made us all want to go to the Alps in France and the children have tried to convince their teachers that they should go there on a field trip. Their writing is very persuasive!



In maths, we have been working with fractions, decimals and percentages. Confidence with converting and ordering these has really grown and all are now experts and ready to use skills learnt in real-life scenarios.

In geography, we are learning about the layers of the rainforest. Again, pupils are showing great creativity and teamwork to present these facts as a class display to educate others.


