

### Dear Families,

This week our focus turned to Children's Mental Health Week and the theme of 'Growing Together'. At King Athelstan our children are fortunate to have access to considerable support: we have our own Nurture Team,

led by Mrs Ramkissoon, who are available not only to all the children in our school but also to the whole school community. They offer support and advice and are also trained as 'Mental Health First Aiders' so can support children with any worries they have. In addition, we have access to our local Mental Health Support Team and their outreach workers, who support both children and families. Working in partnership with you, this support aims for the children to be 'ready to learn', happy and flourishing. If you are struggling with anything at home or would

like to talk to someone about your child, do get in contact with us as we may be able to help. Mrs Ramkissoon or a member of the Inclusion or Senior Leadership Teams are always here to assist and signpost you to further help.

We have had a particularly difficult half term, being very close to placing some classes into remote learning because of absences caused by Covid for both children and staff. Fortunately, this has been avoided through the resilience of our amazing staff team and everyone's determination and collective efforts - members of staff have stepped up again to cover colleagues, amend hours, work longer hours, work at weekends, undertake duties at the last minute on days they were not supposed to be working and above all protect the continuity in health, learning and experiences of the children at King Athelstan. I am very proud of the way everyone in the King Athelstan family has responded to the challenge, putting our children first. I know adding LFTs to the daily routine is an extra pressure but it does, and has, made a difference. After half term, we will be back into our Stage 3 section of our Roadmap, where all trips, some indoor events and more visitors on-site can resume. We look forward to welcoming families of Van Gogh class in person to their assembly in the hall at 9am on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February - this had to be postponed from 26<sup>th</sup> January. Many thanks again for all your patience and support over this time.




#### Early Morning Interventions

#### Safer Internet Day

King Athelstan celebrated Safer Internet Day on Tuesday with a whole school assembly discussing the theme of 'All fun and games?' Activities ranged from story-telling and acting in Key Stage 1, 'troll' designing in lower KS2 and rules for responsible phone use in upper KS2. Children read digital twists on classic fairy tales including 'Chicken Clickin', 'Old MacDonald Had a Phone,' and 'Troll Stinks'! As well as this, children took part in crucial discussions on given internet safety scenarios such as 'What would you do if you lost a mobile phone?' Why not have a discussion at home?


