This week in Year 5 we have been immersing ourselves in the myth of Perseus and Medusa. Following this, we have become authors, scribing our own stories of how Perseus will end up


defeating the terrifying gorgon. In reading this week we have continued on with


our class reader, 'Skellig', and have been finding out more and more about the mysterious creature in Michael's derelict garage.

Our maths learning has involved ordering


fractions and recognising jumps within a sequence in order to

School Lunches

On Monday after half-term, there were 35 children who did not have any lunch booked. Our kitchen cooks meals to order and always cooks a few spare for emergencies, but it was very difficult for us to provide that many. As we cannot guarantee to provide meals to children not booked in, we will ask families to bring in a packed lunch if their child/ren's lunches are not booked on ParentPay. You can book lunches well ahead, so please try to do this to avoid such problems. All school lunches need to be booked on ParentPay before 7am on the day required. If you forget, please always contact the school office before 9am and we will do our best to add the booking.

Book Bags

Please remember that children should only be bringing a book bag to school, and their lunch bag if necessary. Please ensure all items have your child's name on. We do not have space for backpacks or other items (except for Y5 swimming bags). Book bags should not have lots of key rings and toys attached - these make it difficult to fit into children's trays, are also a distraction and should be left at home.

Parent/Carer Consultations

The spring term Parent/Carer Consultations take place in the week beginning 28th February for children with SEND Plans, and the week beginning 7th March for the rest of the school. These are very important and we expect to meet regarding every child. The meetings will once again take place virtually via SchoolCloud- please refer to the letter for details and how to book. Due to the high number of COVID cases this half

term, we were unable to invite families into school to look at their child's books as planned. However, we will invite families in on 15th and 17th March for a 'Book Look' - please see the letter about this and book a slot on the Google form. Thank you.
