Spotlight on French

Our French curriculum at King Athelstan is chatty, creative and fun to learn! At every level we develop our French knowledge:

In Year 3, we have been using lots of pictures to help us to re-create Eric Carle's story of the Artist Who Painted a Blue Horse in French.

In Year 4, we are learning how French links to Latin and our Romans topic by



learning days, months and counting. We are busy asking each other questions about our birthdays too.

In Year 5, children are exploring sports and are able to say their likes and dislikes. This week we have been building on our sentences and have added conjunctions and reasons for our opinions. In Year 6, children are studying nouns connected with seasons and exploring the four (yes four!) ways that you can say "the" in French. We will be using our nouns and colour vocabulary to create season poems. Keep an eye out on Twitter for the finished results towards the end of term. Our KS2 teachers also add in a little French video, song or game

here and there to shorten the gap in between the French sessions. YouTube is a fabulous resource to do the same and listen to French speakers at home. Some of my favourites are Alain le Lait who creates really catchy songs, and Learn French with Alexa has lots of videos on all sorts of topics to revise what we have learnt in class or to practice something new.


