Dear Families,

In assembly this week we looked at some of the traditions around Chinese New Year. Some of the children who had celebrated shared their own experiences. We enjoyed hearing about symbolic food that was shared and the "lucky money" that children received.



You will be aware from our ongoing communications that our own school funding situation is unsustainable. We have already cut significant staff posts and face continuing to do this in order to balance the budget moving forwards. SEN is underfunded nationally and there is a shortfall of between £2k and £8.5k on <u>each</u> EHCP (Education, Health and Care Plan). The unfunded pay rises this financial year have cost the school £108k. In December the gas bill was £5.5k. Our limited reserves will get us through this financial year and next, but then they will have run out.

Please be assured that the team at King Athelstan remain committed to providing the very best education we can with the resources available, however, we continue to be transparent with you all - our staffing structure is spread thinner and thinner and there is very little left to 'cut'. Without significant change at a national level, we cannot continue to operate the service that we do now.

As you know, all classes will be closed on Wednesday 1st February due to the NEU (National Education Union) strike action. I appreciate that this action may cause many of you inconvenience however, teachers only take industrial action as a last resort. The NEU is concerned about the ongoing funding issues in schools and the future of education for our children. It is campaigning for a **fully-funded** and above inflation pay rise for their members, as well as realistic funding for schools so that they can give all children the best education whilst protecting the teaching profession.

Please note, children coming to Breakfast Club, after school clubs or KOOSA Kids on Wednesday do not need to wear school uniform.
