We have recently reviewed our Behaviour Policy and have been


- 3. To continue to develop inclusive provision, to better meet the school's changing and increasingly complex needs profile.

- Learn new sounds in homework books/Google Classroom (KS1)
- Learn spellings sent on Google Classroom (KS2)

- The Thinker's Project was created to encourage children to widen their thinking around their termly topic and to give them the opportunity to express their learning in different contexts
- It is an optional homework. You are encouraged to complete two pieces of Thinker's Project homework per term if possible

Reading Records:

Reading is such an important part of life at King Athelstan. As part of our homework policy children must read every day at home <u>to an adult</u> from Reception to Year 6. Adults must then record what they have read in their reading records. As children get older they can write this themselves.



NB: We are currently waiting for the order of new reading records which should arrive next week, however please still read with your child every day during this time.

Butterfly Dreams

At King Athelstan, we want children to be aspirational and set themselves challenging ambitions. We call these our Butterfly Dreams and link them to the poem here. The children speak about their dreams for the future and what they would like to achieve this year. In PSHE, the children write down their dreams on butterfly cut outs which are displayed in their classrooms. Y6 have been busy cutting out this year's butterflies so that all children can write down their butterfly dreams next week. At the end of the school year, the children discuss and reflect on their Butterfly Dreams and celebrate their successes.

Every year we have one Eco Warrior in each class from Years 1-6. Reporting to Mrs Williamson, Mehretu class teacher and Eco Warriors Lead, the Eco Warriors will examine some of the significant environmental issues facing our world today, such as air pollution, deforestation, the threat of plastic consumption and global warming.

Eco Warriors

The Eco Warriors will meet regularly to:

- implement the King Athelstan Eco Code
- develop an action plan for areas we feel we can tackle
- share ideas with their classes, the school and the wider community

Mrs Williamson will lead an assembly next week to explain all to the children, and we will then issue application forms for any child who is interested in applying to be a Warrior.

PE Days
