We now have all of our new Nursery and Reception children in. They are doing really well and are engaging positively with their new learning environments. Well done! This week our behaviour policy focus is on our first rule "we are safe". Next week, we will focus on rule 2 "we are kind". Well done to all the children who have worked hard on implementing our school rules every day. Miss Govan leads these assemblies.



In my assembly we reflected on the kinds of things children had done to improve their writing over the first few



weeks of term. I was really impressed with the detail children gave. We talked about making changes so that every day was better than the last. As you are aware, improving writing is a key area of our School Development Plan (SDP) this year. We also talked about how getting 'stuck' in the learning pit is brilliant. It's where you do your best learning and improve your skills. Here's the image we use to help children understand how getting stuck improves your learning.

School Crossing Patrol

Here is a message from our School Crossing Patrol man:

Hi Everyone, I hope you all had a great time over the summer. For the benefit of new parents, carers and children, please allow me to introduce myself. I'm Andy and I'm your School Crossing Patrol (Lollipop Man). Villiers Road is very busy so here's a few guidelines so you get familiar with how I work:

- Please wait on the pavement and I'll let you know when I consider it safe for you to cross
- When crossing, always walk, don't run as this can be dangerous
- If you come to school on a bike or scooter, please get off and push it as you cross
- Occasionally at busy times I will ask you to wait at the crossing. As well as helping
 you to cross, I also have to try and keep traffic moving. This is especially important
 if there's a police car, ambulance or a fire engine.



Office Messages

Here are a few reminders from the school office:

- Make sure you put your child's name on all clothing and other items that they bring to school so we can return items which become separated
- Email any message about a child's pick up before 2.30pm so we have time to ensure staff are aware
- Ensure you put your child's full name and class in any messages as we do have several children with the same/similar name
- Book lunches on ParentPay (no charge) for every day that you require you can do this up to half-term

Free School Meals

All children in primary school are entitled to a universal free school lunch. However, if you are in receipt of benefits, your child may qualify for benefits-related free school meals and be Pupil Premium. This means you may also receive free meal vouchers during school holidays and qualify for a free extra-curricular club or free clubs during school holidays with KOOSA Kids or other providers. 
Eco Warriors


School Council

Our Mystery Reader scheme was such a success last year that we will be running it again this year for classes from Nursery up to Year 2. The idea is that one parent/carer or any adult family member has the opportunity to read a story to the class each week, at the end of the day/session. The identity of the reader will remain a secret until they walk into the classroom! The story can be up to 10



minutes long, and you may want to choose your child's favourite. Feel free to read a story in your home language if you wish.
