Junior Roadwatch

As part of this initiative, primary school children are given the opportunity to take part in

speed awareness sessions with police officers to help educate drivers about the dangers of speeding near their school. Drivers caught speeding are pulled over by police officers and are either given a fixed penalty fine and points on their licence or have to attend a speed awareness course. If the police think it



appropriate, they will ask the drivers to speak to the children. The children ask questions such as "Why do you think the speed limit is 20mph on this road?" and "Are you

aware of the consequences of

speeding?" which encourage the drivers to

reconsider their speed. The children really enjoyed using the speed gun and trying on the uniforms - they were allowed to sit in the Police van, too.

Hay Fever

In this hot weather we have many children coming to first aiders or the medical room suffering from hay fever, experiencing symptoms such as sneezing/coughing, runny/blocked nose, itchy red or watery eyes, itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears. If your child has hay fever, please treat them at home before they come to school. There are a number of children's medicines which you can give at home before school, to help relieve the symptoms. This



will support your child during the day so that they are comfortable and have minimal distractions from their learning. We cannot give such medication in school. Junior Cadets is an excellent opportunity for young people to make new friendship circles and participate in various fun activities such as Duke of Edinburgh, paintballing, hikes etc.

Junior Volunteer Police Cadets has launched in Kingston. It is aimed at young people aged 10 -13 years old who take part in a programme which will teach them life skills, social responsibility and help build positive relationships with the police.

The programme is led by senior volunteer police cadets (VPC), police officers and cadet Leaders who have been coached and trained in mentoring and leadership, to provide positive role models to their younger peers.

The programme provides a safe consistent activity for them as they make the transition from primary to secondary school. It also involves junior and senior cadets working together to design problem solving projects and initiatives to address key issues in their communities around crime prevention and community safety.

We hold the Junior Cadets at the TA Centre on Portsmouth Road after school on a Wednesday between 1715 - 1830 hours. The Cadets wear a very simple uniform (provided free of charge). Please contact PC Juliet Saunders for more information. juliet.e.saunders@met.police.uk
