



Music & Creativity Summer Course - 29 July - 1st August

This four-day course for 6-11 year olds will involve music making in lots of different ways including percussion,



singing, musical games, learning the keyboard and composing their own pieces. It is run by Kingston Music Service and is held at Hook Library. Students will also work in the library on exciting Lego and craft projects, as well as working with Nuffield Health on an hour's fun physical activity each day.

The course which runs from 10:30 until 15:30 from 29th July to 1st August includes a midmorning snack and lunch each day. The 4-day course costs £128 with free places available to children on benefit related free school meals through the FUEL scheme. For more
