Dear Families,

This week our school rule focus was on "We listen to everyone". Well done to those children who demonstrate this as they go about their day to day routines in school.



We have been increasingly aware of cars belonging to King Athelstan families that are parked illegally in the area around school at drop off and pick up. This has resulted in several near-misses where children could be seriously hurt and we have received a number of complaints from our neighbours. For the safety of **all** children and families, please park legally and safely every day. The corner of Dawson Road opposite the front entrance has double-yellow lines because it is a main place to cross for pedestrians. If you park here, children are forced to cross between cars where they cannot be seen, or they have to go out and around cars on busy Villiers Rd. Parking on the yellow zigzags outside school is never permitted, and parking illegally in residents' spaces in the local area is obstructing our neighbours and blocking access. Parking on any double yellow lines in the local area causes significant danger. It is also modelling to children that it is OK to deliberately cause danger, and our first rule in school is "we are safe". Please be more considerate.

Just a reminder that next Friday 4th October is an INSET day and children are not in school.

Next week is our Harvest Festival celebration - read more about donations for this later in the Digest. A letter has also gone out to all today.

Parent/Carer Consultation Meetings

Families will receive a letter today about booking an appointment for Parent/Carer Consultation meeting with their child's teacher. Appointments are in the week of 21^{st} October, are available for online or in-person meetings, and each meeting lasts ten minutes. There will be an opportunity to look at your child's books and see their work on Friday 18^{th} October, or directly before your appointment if it is in person. Separate meetings will be made for children with SEND, and for Little Klee (2 year olds), and also for Matisse Class. Please book an appointment for each child. Thank you.

Breaktime Snacks

Please remember that King Athelstan is a nut-free school and children must not have any



nuts or nut products in their lunchbox or as snacks. We encourage healthy snacks for breaktime, a piece of fruit or vegetable is ideal, such as carrot. No other snacks are permitted at playtime. Children should not have crisps or sweets/chocolate. Please be aware that many cereal bars also contain nuts and are not acceptable. Thank you.



Free School Meals

All children in primary school are entitled to a universal free school lunch. However, if you are in receipt of benefits, your child may qualify for benefits-related free school meals and Pupil Premium. This means you may also receive free meal vouchers during school holidays and qualify for a free extra-curricular club or free clubs during school holidays with KOOSA Kids or other providers. 
