Starting Reception in September 2025

Children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 are due to start reception class at primary school in September 2025. Applications for a Reception place at King Athelstan close on Wednesday 15 January 2025. Poppy Appeal

In November 2024 members of our Junior Leadership Team collected money for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal by selling poppy pin badges and other items in the playground after school. The charity has recently



informed us that we managed to raise £106.99 of the grand total of £28,000. The Royal British Legion uses the money raised to provide support to the Armed Forces community and ex-service personnel in six key areas: Financial Support, Advice, Employment, Mobility, Housing and Mental Health.

Focus on Handwriting

At the last Parent/Carer Forum in November, some parents wanted to discuss handwriting. They asked about pen licenses and how to support children with letter formation and good handwriting habits. In school, the teaching of handwriting starts with mark making in Nursery and then moves on to the teaching of phonics in Reception and KS1. We use phrases like 'Birdy Fingers' to remind the children of their 'Tripod Grip', which means they initiate their pencil grip with the shape of a bird's beak (right).



We also use 'letter families' to teach children how to form each letter correctly. Once children are confident with their pencil grip, they move through handwriting targets with bronze, silver and gold awards. Once they have achieved their gold award they are presented with a 'pen licence' which means they can move from writing in pencil to writing in blue pen.
