Dear Families,

Our spotlight for this week was on our listening skills: We listen to everyone, with a particular focus on the importance of listening to adult instructions. Next week our spotlight will be led by Mrs Williamson and our team of Eco Warriors with a focus on taking care of our school.



In assembly this week, we examined the story of The Star Thrower by Loren Eiseley (1907-1977), which goes like this:

Once upon a time, there was an old man who used to go to the ocean to do his writing. He had a habit of walking on the beach every morning before he began his work. Early one morning, he was walking along the shore after a big storm had passed and found the vast beach littered with starfish as far as the eye could see, stretching in both directions.

Off in the distance, the old man noticed a small boy approaching. As the boy walked, he paused every so often and as he grew closer, the man could see that he was occasionally bending down to pick up an object and throw it into the sea. The boy came closer still and the man called out, "Good morning! May I ask what it is that you are doing?"



The young boy paused, looked up, and replied "Throwing starfish into the ocean. The tide has washed them up onto the beach and they can't return to the sea by themselves. When the sun gets high, they will die, unless I throw them back into the water."

The old man responded, "But there must be tens of thousands of starfish on this beach. I'm afraid you won't really be able to make much of a difference."

The boy bent down, picked up yet another starfish and threw it as far as he could into the ocean. Then he turned, smiled and said, "It made a difference to that one!"

We reflected that, even though sometimes issues can seem very big and overwhelming, each of us can make a small difference and these can add up to bigger change. This is relevant at all levels, from global issues such as climate change to looking after our school and each other. It can be tempting to think 'well, other people don't bother' but we can only control our own actions and we never know who else we might influence to make a change!

Just a final reminder to all families that the <u>gates are locked at 8:45am</u> for KS1 and KS2. Children arriving at or after this time **must** go through the office where parents/carers must sign them in to ensure they are registered correctly which is important for the children's safety. We have seen an increase in children and families arriving at 8:45 as the gates are being locked (or later). Please also remember to keep the movement flowing by not stopping to handover belongings or watch children going into the building as this blocks the pathway for others. Thank you for your support with this.

The King Athelstan Governing Body currently has a vacancy for a Parent Governor, and information and application forms were emailed to all families on Wednesday 22^{nd} January.



- Agreeing the school improvement strategy with priorities and targets
- Meeting statutory duties to support the school in achieving these goals.

Focus on Maths KIRF

KIRF (Key Instant Recall of Facts) have been designed to support the development of the mental skills that underpin much of the maths work in schools, especially mental maths. Every half term, each year group from Y1-Y6 will have a focus and by the end of each half term, children should know those facts. In class, each child will complete three space races based on the focus, which will then be sent home so you can see the facts they need to practise further. The aim is for them to recall these facts instantly. It is expected that the children will learn and practise these in school AND at home. for all the KIRFs for each year group each term so that you can help your children at home. Here is the KIRF overview for all (right). Remember, the Y2-6 Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) Glow Up update takes place today - if children log in to TTRS they can see the exciting changes and customise the colours etc on their account. They may need to log out and back in again to see these changes.

Y5 Swimming

Swimming forms a vital part of PE in the National Curriculum, and school has a legal requirement to teach all children water safety and to swim 25m by the time they reach the age of 11. The ParentPay item is still open for families who have not yet made a contribution to the cost of the coach. At King Athelstan, we are currently taking Y5 to swimming lessons at the Malden Centre, New Malden in the spring term, as we have done for the last few years since the Kingfisher Leisure Centre closed in 2020. The lessons are taught by Mr McLaughlin and a team of instructors according to the children's ability. The children are taught the following:

- To swim competently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- To be able to use a range of strokes effectively front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.
- To perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.



This year's Y5 are enjoying their lessons, and working hard on their swimming skills. Thank you to the Y5 parents who are accompanying the group each week on a rota basis - we really value your help. We have had positive feedback from other users of the pool saying how quiet the children are in the changing rooms and that they are well-behaved around the Centre. Keep it up, Y5!

Ice/Heat Packs for First Aid



We use these re-usable medical packs in school, which can be deployed as either ice or heat packs depending on the situation. Unfortunately, many of them seem to have disappeared and we now have very few. These are a regular item on our Amazon Wish List for this reason! We always ask children in school to return them to the Medical Room, and would like to ask if you find any at home to please return them, too. Thank you.
