The Story of the 2 Wolves

A young boy arrived home angry and upset. His grandfather asked him what had happened so the boy began to talk about how he had fallen out with his sister that morning. He complained that he had thought about the bad things she had said all day. The grandfather looked out of the window, and then turned to the boy. He looked him in the eyes and said, "My son, inside every person's heart lives two wolves that often fight. One wolf is the vengeful, angry, violent one. The other wolf is the loving, compassionate one." The grandson asked him, "Which one wins?" The grandfather answered: "The one you feed."



We then asked the questions: Do you think there are really 2 wolves inside every person's heart? What does the story mean? Which wolf will you feed?

We also looked at a story about Kevan Chandler, a man with spinal muscular atrophy, who said "nothing is out of reach". School Uniform Reminder

Please remember that children should either be in full school uniform, or their PE uniform on PE/sports club days. Both of these consist of a plain white top (or one with the King Athelstan logo) and plain black bottoms, whether that's a skirt, pinafore, trousers, shorts or jogging bottoms. Any other coloured items are not part of our school uniform, nor are clothes with brand logos or coloured accessories. Tights and socks can be black, white or grey. All children should be wearing the purple King Athelstan cardigan or sweatshirt with their uniform and PE uniform. Shoes should be flat, plain black

Focus on Reading

Reading for pleasure is at the top of our reading agenda at King Athelstan and we work hard to create a positive reading environment. We promote reading in school with the following initiatives:

- Reading Corners: each class has a reading corner which is full of classical and contemporary children's literature
- The Bucket List (reading spine): each year group has an extensive list of books that the children are encouraged to read by the end of the year – for each book read the children receive a sticker to collect on their 'Bucket List Bingo Chart' <u>CLICK HERE</u> to find out more.
- Home Reading Scheme: our home reading scheme is an eclectic mix of fiction and non-fiction
- Free Reading Time: at different points of the day the children are encouraged to read for pleasure
- Story Time: teachers read stories to children all the way from Nursery to Year 6 - you are never too old to enjoy a good story!
- Library: we are constantly adding books to our library and classes have scheduled times to visit to choose books to develop their love of reading
- Reading Record Scheme: Children in Y1-Y6 have a reading record book where their reading at home is logged and they collect dots. For every 20 dots they will receive either a certificate or a reading record prize!
- Hosting visiting authors; when we can, we invite children's authors to come in, meet the children and talk about their life and work as an author. Last year, we hosted 2 authors, and went to the Rose Theatre to hear a third. Last term we were visited by Jack Meggitt-Phillips, and coming up on 6th February is a visit by children's author Kieran Larwood.

We also celebrate World Book Day annually in the first week of March. This is always a special day in the King Athelstan calendar; we plan a carousel of activities all linked to a story and the children get to experience creative lessons throughout the day as well as dressing up as a book character or in their pyjamas ready for a bedtime



story! Watch out for further information about this year's activities soon. As parents and carers, you can support the love of reading at home by listening to your child read and reading to them daily. Bed time stories and reading at home not only increase academic ability, but also help to strengthen family relationships and foster a lifelong love of books. Thank you.

Breakfast Club

There are currently some places available in our Breakfast Club, which is open 7.45 to 8.45am daily for children in Reception to Y6. It is located in the King Athelstan Centre at the back of the School. Children attending are given a choice of breakfasts such as cereals, yoghurt, fruit, toast, and juice and undertake a mixture of fun and educational activities, before being taken to their classes in time for registration. The charge is £6.50 per day. The Breakfast Club is run by King Athelstan Staff, and a registration form must be completed by a parent/carer before the


