Ramadan Observance

We are aware that Ramadan will start soon and have made plans to support any children in school who, with their families' consent, will be fasting on some or all of the days. We have asked families to let us know if you would like your child to fast during Ramadan so that we can ensure these children remain well during the day. If a fasting child is feeling unwell, they will be seen by a first aider and a call home will be made for advice. Warhol Classroom will be a quiet space available over lunchtime for any children who wish to pray: 12.30pm for girls and 12.40pm



for boys. Any child who wants some quiet space can go to our designated Quiet Rooms at break and lunchtimes. Please let us know if you would like your child to fast or pray so that we can support them. Thank you.

School Trips

We have a number of exciting school trips planned for the rest of the spring and summer terms. Please go to ParentPay to give consent and pay, if applicable, so that your child can attend. We welcome parent/carer volunteers to accompany trips, and every volunteer must have a current DBS certificate (Disclosure and Barring Service) for safeguarding purposes. Each DBS certificate lasts for three years, so in that time you can attend many trips! To apply for a DBS, complete the form here. You will be sent a link to do an online application, and will need to provide three forms of ID. Once you receive your certificate, please bring it in to the office so that we can log it and let staff know that you can volunteer. The whole process usually takes about two weeks, depending on how quickly you can complete all parts of the application. Please note, each DBS application costs the school and so we have an item in ParentPay for those who are able to donate some or all of the cost. Thank you so much to all the parents and carers who already volunteer - we would not be able to run the trips without you.

King Athelstan Chicks

It's that time of year and we are very pleased to announce that we will be having our very own chicks on site! Next week, the Happy Chick company will be providing 10 eggs in an incubator to our Reception classrooms where the children will keep a watchful eye on them and the subsequent chicks.
