Y5 Trip to All Saints Church

Year 5 enjoyed their trip to St John the Evangelist Church this week. The children explored and learnt about things which are found in a church, such as 'nave' and 'font'. They also found out



about the different meanings behind the colours of the Vicar's robes, as well as celebrating Lent. They had lots of time to ask questions about Christianity which links to their curriculum, and to admire the amazing stained-glass windows.



Y6 Trip to Kew Gardens



Year 6 chose a lovely day for their trip to Kew Gardens on Thursday - the warmest day of the year so far! As part of their 'Into the Forest' topic they took part in an immersive

experience, exploring the complex rainforest habitat and variety of rainforest plants located in one of Kew's famous glasshouses.



Mobile Phones in School

We appreciate that older children in Year 5 and Year 6 have mobile phones as they are often travelling to and from school on their own, with parents'/carers' permission. Children below Year 5 are not permitted to walk home alone, and therefore should not have a phone in school. The children in Y5 and Y6 know that any phone must not be used on school premises, including in the bike sheds/car park/coming through the gates. They must switch off their phone and hand it in to an adult in their classroom. If a child uses their phone on site/does not switch it off/does not hand it in then the phone is confiscated and parents/carers are contacted to callect it. If a child



hand it in, then the phone is confiscated and parents/carers are contacted to collect it. If a child refuses to hand over their phone, parents/carers will be called to remove it. Please remember also that children should not have smart watches in school, as these may have cameras and internet connection.

Y5/Y6 Tag Rugby Competition



20 children from Y5-Y6 had a great morning playing tag rugby earlier in the week. It was a fantastic competition and it was lovely to see the progress the children made throughout the day. Congratulations to the A team who had an amazing achievement, they reach the Bowl final

Y4 Trip to the Natural History Museum
