Welcome back! We hope you all had a good Easter break and are ready for the new term.

As is typical for this time of year, the weather is very unpredictable and it can be very chilly in the shade, even on sunny days. Please make sure your children have their (named) school sweatshirts/cardigans with them, and also coats/hats/sun cream applied as appropriate.

As we mentioned in the last Digest before Easter, we are working with Sarah Cantrill from Story Storks (<https://www.storystorks.co.uk>), and All Saints Church on an event to mark the 1100th anniversary of the crowning of King Athelstan in Kingston. It is called "On the Origin of King Athelstan School".



The aim is to uncover the school's history and links back to the celebrated first King of all England. Our Key Stage 2 children will take to the stage at All Saints Church on **19th June**, performing a special theatrical piece that tells the story of King Athelstan's life and legacy, as well as the school's journey from opening. No spoilers, but there will be Mercians, Saxons and Vikings all appearing in the event! Our EYFS and Key Stage 1 pupils will be busy behind the scenes – contributing to the set and learning songs that will feature in the performance. We will send out ticket information in the coming weeks, but please make a note of the date.

This project offers our pupils a chance to connect deeply with local history, while also building confidence, collaboration skills, and a love of storytelling through performance. It's a great example of how the arts can enrich learning and bring a community together.

We really need your help in gathering memories online from people who attended King Athelstan Primary School in the past, particularly in the 1960s. *Children in Year 4 will be taking the 'Multiplication Tables Check' to determine whether year 4 pupils can fluently recall their multiplication tables. It is a key stage 2 (KS2) assessment to be taken by pupils at the end of year 4, which is statutory.

Maths KIRF (Key Instant Recall of Facts) have been designed to support the development of the mental skills that underpin much of the maths work in schools. Every half term, each year group has a focus and by the end of each half term, children should know those facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts instantly. On the left you can see the annual overview by year group, by term. We have just started summer 1, so the children will be concentrating on these maths facts. It is expected that the children will learn and practise these in school AND at home. Thank you.

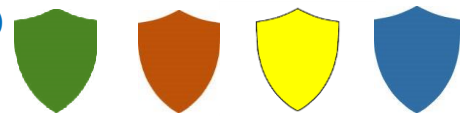
